#### **Project Description**

The purpose of this research project is to examine the impact of gender(ed) politics and relations on television (TV) production outcomes and the 'real-world' impacts of affective fan engagement as two distinct yet connected spaces of visualised womanhood. As a genre predominantly negotiated by and for men, exploring how women create and respond to science fiction texts that foreground women's stories will inform an understanding of how and where women are given opportunities for creative engagement, and how they respond in ways that challenge dominant power structures.

If you identify as a woman are 18+ and have worked on the production of (name of text) you are invited to participate in this research project.

Please note: this project advances a feminist account of 'woman' that respects trans, non-binary and genderqueer identities to provide an inclusive challenge to the systemic oppression of womanhood.

#### **Participation**

If you agree to participate in this research project, you will be asked to complete an interview with Amanda Fiedler. The interview will be conducted via videoconferencing (Zoom) at a mutually convenient time, and, with your permission, the interview will be audio-recorded. The interview will take approximately 40 to 55 minutes and will ask questions such as: What was your position in the production? As a TV creative, how does the existing employment structures within the industry impact you? (How long have you been a member of the online community? How did you first get involved? In what ways do you benefit from your involvement?)

Your participation is voluntary.

If you decide to take part and later change your mind, you are free to withdraw at any time. Please contact the Chief Investigator (listed above) to discuss withdrawal.

#### Consent

You will be asked to provide written consent.

Consent is for the use of your insights in this project as well as future related research projects. This interview will be audio recorded. Data from this interview will be de-identified by deleting audio recordings once non-identifiable transcripts or notes have been produced and will be stored securely with access only by the researchers.

#### **Risks and Benefits**

There are minimal risks associated with your participation, which may include uncomfortable feelings. You are not required to answer any questions you don't want to, and you may discontinue or pause the interview at any time if required. Results from the interviews will be aggregated and used to understand how individuals experience their engagement with the sci-fi texts and their position within the industry.

During or after the interview process, you may be asked explicit permission to identify you in the project reporting in relation to a specific answer or response. You have the option to refuse permission at this stage or upon review of the transcript.

Any data collected as a part of this research project will be stored securely as per USC's Research Data Management Procedures. The results of this research project may be presented at external or internal conferences or meetings, or by publication.
